Catherine Hayward is a fashion editor, stylist and consultant with 25+ years in publishing and media. A former Fashion Director of British Esquire, The Big Black Book and Fashion Editor of British GQ, she regularly contributes to Esquire, Mr Porter, The Hollywood Reporter, The Telegraph Magazine, Grazia and The Times Luxx Report. She was a member of the BFC's menswear and NEWGEN Men committees and co-authored Man About Town, a glossy history hardback charting the evolution of men's style in the 20th century. She is also a mentor for the British Fashion Council Industry Mentor Hub. Her red carpet clients include Benedict Cumberbatch, Daniel Craig, Vicky McClure, Charles Edwards, Ciaran Hinds, Paapa Essiedu, Hugh Skinner, Jeremy Irvine, Stephen Merchant and Marcelino Sambe.

She is currently the Editor-at-Large of Calendar Magazine, the sustainable glossy and the Fashion Editor of the Times Luxx Report for Men.

Mark Ravenhill is a playwright. He has been an Associate Artist of the National Theatre in London and Playwright In Residence at the Royal Shakespeare Company. He is a trustee of the Royal Court Theatre. Major plays include *Shopping and Fucking* (1996), *Some Explicit Polaroids* (1999), *Mother Clap's Molly House* (2000), *The Cut* (2006), *Shoot Get Treasure Repeat* (2008), *Ten Plagues – A Song Cycle* (2011), *The Cane* (2018), *The Boy in the Dress* (2019) and *Ben and Imo* (2024).

Janty Yates has been working in films and TV since 1979, working on many varied projects, set in many varied periods and for many different directors.

She became an HOD Costume Designer in 1988 and has had a collaborative relationship with Sir Ridley Scott since 1998 and it is for the great success of *Gladiator* that she won an Academy Award for Best Costume Design – one of the eight Oscars the film won. She was also nominated for a BAFTA, a Golden Satellite and a Saturn Award.

She has had CDG nominations for *De-lovely*, for *The Martian* and for *House of Gucci*. Golden Satellite nominations for *De-lovely* and *House of Gucci* and a Goya nomination for *Kingdom of Heaven*.

During her career she has worked with Michael Mann (*Miami Vice*), Jean-Jacques Annaud (*Enemy at the Gates*), Irwin Winkler (*De-lovely*), John Amiel (*The Man Who Knew too Little*), Michael Winterbottom (*Jude* and *Welcome to Sarajevo*), Gillian Anderson (*Charlotte Grey*) and Jake Scott (*Plunkett & Maclean*).

During her collaboration with Sir Ridley Scott Janty has worked on such diverse films as *Hannibal*, *American Gangster*, *Kingdom of Heaven*, *Robin Hood*, *Prometheus*, *Exodus*, *Gods* & *Kings*, *The Martian*, *Alien: Covenant*, *All the Money in the World*, *The Last Duel*, *House of Gucci* and, most recently, *Napoleon*.

Since 2015, the London Spanish Film Festival has gathered every year a Jury formed by three to five members of the British film, media and overall culture sectors to decide a Best Film, with the possibility of awarding a special mention.

Films in competition* are all recent (current/previous year) long feature films in program.

Over the course of eight days we'll be celebrating Spanish cinema and its talent at Ciné Lumière and Riverside Studios with several guests appearances including filmmakers, actors, producers and costume designers.

This is a very special edition as we celebrate 20 years offering to London audiences, consistently and uninterruptedly, a window into Spain, its culture, its cinema and its talented artists.

Colombo works at a parking lot and tops up his meager wages by selling weed. Mario is a lawyer and a keen birdwatcher whom, due to a past accident, is unable to drive. Mario offers to pay Colombo to drive him from Valencia to a lake in Spain's Costa Brava, where he wants to see some cranes. Upon reaching the lake, Mario tells Colombo that the birds have changed their migratory route and are now going to nest in the Danube delta in Constanza, Romania... Much more than a trans-European road movie blending comedy and drama, *Pájaros* is about two men who are lost but who get to know and to help themselves and each other along the way. The performances by Gutiérrez and Zahera as perfectly flawed anti-heroes attempting to escape their lives are simply wonderful.

Set against the backdrop of the Spanish Civil War's end, this film is an adaptation of Raymond Queneau's 1947 pulp novel *We Always Treat Women Too Well*. A compelling Carmen Machi plays an ultra-fascist, borderline psychopath, who is to marry a fascist comander. On her own she will manage to achieve the bloody elimination of a group of uncoordinated and naive Republican soldiers who have occupied the local post office of the small town. She will achieve this partly exploiting male sexual desire and their idea of a woman's fragility. Best known as a costume designer, Clara Bilbao's debut film is a very dark comedy but also a powerful and daring anti-war satire.

Seville-born Francisco Bech has always been deeply connected to the music scene in his hometown. In 2011, he agreed with Rafael Riqueni to document the recording of his upcoming album.

Unexpected circumstances turned this project into a much longer journey than initially planned, with the documentary's filming only concluding in 2023. Throughout these years, Bech faithfully followed Riqueni's journey back to the stage, eventually becoming his manager. Bech's documentary immerses viewers in the highs and lows of one of the greatest maestros in the history of flamenco guitar, whose music, influenced by both jazz and classical genres, has earned him international acclaim.

Lucía, a middle-aged single woman working as an IT programmer, faces a challenging situation when she loses her job in a struggling market. Deciding to take a drastic turn in her life, she buys a taxi and its license. In her new role as a taxi driver, she encounters a variety of interesting people and discovers a newfound freedom and confidence she never imagined. This transformation is superbly depicted through the costumes designed by Clara Bilbao. Based on the novel by Juan José Millás, Méndez Esparza takes us on a suspenseful journey through the streets of Madrid. Malena Alterio's portrayal of Lucía has earned her several Best Actress awards.

Juan Francisco Viruega's opera prima first follows Alba as she returns to her hometown after a romantic breakup, and then Candela, the sister who stayed home by the side of their now terminally ill mother. Together, Alba and Candela will confront and heal childhood woonds as they accompany their mother in her last days. The striking Almería desert and sea serve as both a backdrop and a silent witness, almost like another character in the film. "Amanece" (Sunrise) is an intimate exploration of the emotions experienced when revisiting childhood places, resolving past conflicts, and finding the healing power of acceptance, leading to light and a new beginning.

Despite being unemployed, Milagros is determined to be a mother. That's why she arrives to Seville in her father's '67 Corvair with the intention of persuading Jonathan to be her sperm donor and thus starting a delirious trip alongside a young woman picked on the road, called Queen of Triana and who claims to be a mermaid in urgent need of getting to the sea. More than a freewheeling road movie, *On the Go* is an adventure full of fun, music, dance, sex and stunning Andalusian landscapes.

In a country destroyed by a civil war and in the midst of a dictatorship a film school was created. Against any intention by the regime, it became a space of freedom. The dream only lasted fifteen years, but it changed forever the history of Spanish cinema giving some of its greatest directors: Juan Antonio Bardem, Luis García Berlanga, Carlos Saura, Víctor Erice, Basilio Martín Patino, José Luis Borau... The practice exercises of the students are still in the archives of the School. Parés makes a formidable excersice himself with the archival material helping understand the greatness of the dreams of those filmmaking students observing the modernisation process of a country ravaged by many traumas.

Now best known as Ventotene, Pandataria is a small island in the Tyrrhenian Sea historically used by the Romans to exile high society adulteresses, nonconforming women, and those who amassed too much power or influence. Centuries later, Mussolini imprisoned political dissidents there.

"Pandataria" is also the title of a show by an independent dance company that explores the island's history, reclaiming it as a symbol of diversity and feminism. *Map to Pandataria* documents the company's exciting yet complicated journey as they navigate various complications, including the challenge of premiering at the historic Roman theater of Mérida.

Inspired by a feminist science fiction story written by Rokeya Hossain in 1905 in Bengal, Inés embarks on a journey through India searching for the traces of Ladyland, a utoptian country for women. Helguera's unconventional story, which partly mirrors her own journey, includes fictional and real characters, such as philosopher Paul B. Preciado and English scholar Mary Beard, who have lent their voices to the film. In her debut feature film, veteran animator Herguera employs watercolour-style animation combined with the Mehndi technique, usually associated to henna temporary skin decorations, achieving strikingly beautiful results.

In 2011, when ETA announced the definitive cessation of its armed activity in Spain, a young woman arrives to Zubieta, a small village by the Bidassoa river and the border with France. She wants to cross the border but, waiting for the sign, she will have to wait much longer than expected.

In this isolated place, time, scopes and perspectives begin to blur. *Negu Hurbilak* is a powerful and unconventional project exploring the consequences of having to bear silence and the cost of working under secrecy, including the disappearance of individual identity as well as family and emotional ties. The directing credit of Negu Collective keeps the consistency between the production of the film and its story, the ruins of the Basque conflict.

Laura Jou's second feature film is emotionally tense and complex. It not only delves into pain and frustration, but also the courage of a woman confronting life's challenges, exploring her resilience against societal expectations of success. The film maintains a thrilling pace that will keep you on the edge of your seat. It is produced by the acclaimed Juan Antonio Bayona.

During her stay in Burgos she will learn the story of Antoni Benaiges, a young teacher from Tarragona who was her grandfather's schoolmaster before the war. Using an innovative pedagogical method that involved producing small publications, Antoni inspired his students and made them a promise: he would take them to see the sea. Based on a book by Francesc Escribano, which in turn is based on real events, Patricia Font's second feature film is a moving story lead by two outstanding actors and weaving memory, loss and the tragedies of the Spanish Civil War.

In 1971, in the Galician countryside, María is asstists women in childbirth. After an attempt to help a young woman in trouble, she suddenly must hide from the authorities, leaving everything behind and flee to Portugal via an old smugglers' route. Camborda, whom also wrote the script, explores in *O corno* female solidarity, the relationship between our body and our decisions, and women's ability to conceive and give birth. Beautifully shot, the film won the Golden Seashell at the San Sebastián Film Festival and lead actress Janet Novás the Best New Actress Goya Award.

Emilio Fonseca's camera delves into the Galician-Portuguese mountains, tracking images and absences of the native Iberian wolf. This film-essay searches justice and investigates the story of a relationship charged with subjugation and extermination, creating simulacrum images of the wild natural. Rather an anti-documentary, *Salvaxes*, *Salvaxes* offers us wolves that look at the camera terrified and humans that howl, where all creatures leave traces. Fonseca's is a fascinating work using new and unconventional ways to explore the relationship between humans and non-humans.

After the success of *Julia's Eyes*, Spanish filmmaker Guillem Morales once again astonishes audiences with a US-produced, UK-based psychological thriller, *The Wasp*. Based on Morgan Lloyd Malcolm's play of the same title, Morales explores the depths of childhood traumas, emotional scars, and mental issues, providing a rich canvas for the lead actresses to showcase their talents under his direction.

MEMORY AND UTOPY

In 2023, SEMINCI, Valladolid International Film Week, created "Memory and Utopy", a section conceived to reflect on the History of Cinema, a space to rediscover important works that, for various circumstances, remain outside the canon. Presented in recently restored copies, they should help reivindicating the importance of the filmic legacy and those institutions that preserve it.

"Memory and Utopy", made in collaboration with the Instituto Cervantes, includes films that break with prejudices and show the nonconformity and the visionary quality of the cinematographic image. They also represent dreamlike and ghostly catalysts able to suggest and captivate audiences. By including the work of two pioneers, like the Spaniard Ana Mariscal and the Mexican Maite Landeta, this section questions the patriarchal perspective from which they histories of our cinemas have been written. Exactly as does Luis E. Parés' opera prima, *The First Look*, about the first cinema school in Spain.

In a country destroyed by a civil war and in the midst of a dictatorship a film school was created. Against any intention by the regime, it became a space of freedom. The dream only lasted fifteen years, but it changed forever the history of Spanish cinema giving some of its greatest directors: Juan Antonio Bardem, Luis García Berlanga, Carlos Saura, Víctor Erice, Basilio Martín Patino, José Luis Borau... The practice exercises of the students are still in the archives of the School. Parés makes a formidable excersice himself with the archival material helping understand the greatness of the dreams of those filmmaking students observing the modernisation process of a country ravaged by many traumas.

EL CAMINO | The Road

dir. Ana Mariscal, with Julia Caba Alba, Maribel Martín, José Antonio Mejías, José Orjas, Asunción Balaguer | Spain | 1964 | 95 min | In Spanish with English subtitles

Based on Miguel Delibes' book by the same title, *El camino* tells the story of a boy who has to leave his small town to go and study in a city. In the hours preceding his departure he reminisces about his small town and its people. Influenced by Italian Neorrealism, Ana Mariscal, who was also a popular actress and a writer, poignantly portrays daily life in a small town in the province of Avila. Although the town appears bucolic, Mariscal delves into the oppressive atmosphere of the regime, religion, self-righteous neighbors, and the lack of opportunities in post-war Spain. The film faced censorship and was sadly forgotten for many years. Nevertheless, it was part of the Cannes Classics program in 2021 in its restored version.

TROTACALLES | Streetwalker

In Mexico City, sisters Maria and Elena reunite after several years apart, only to find themselves competing for the affection of Rodolfo, a manipulative pimp. Elena, seeking an escape from her uneventful marriage to an elderly banker, falls into Rodolfo's arms. Meanwhile, Maria, supported by a close-knit group of fellow sex workers, navigates the challenges posed by exploitative clients and her unscrupulous pimp. Matilde Landeta was one of the few women working behind the camera in Mexican cinema for many years. Her *Trotacalles* is a story of female solidarity in a world where women are either trophies or exploited. Although Landeta aimed for a realistic depiction, production requirements led the film to take on a more melodramatic tone.
